Campfire Talk: Carnivorous Killer Plants

Join us for a fun campfire talk in the great outdoors! Campfire Talks are a series of educational & entertaining programs located in the great outdoors. Campfire programs are held many Friday & Saturday evening (May – October) in DeSoto State Park.

'Feed Me Seymour!' Come on out to discover facts about these unusual plants that are carnivorous, meaning they digest insects and other organisms. They live in boggy, wet areas that are low in nutrients, and have evolved over time to eat prey to survive. People have long been drawn to these weird but lovable plants, enthralled by visions of man-eaters out of "Little Shop of Horrors." (no worries, none are big enough to eat humans.... yet)

Join DeSoto State Park Naturalist Brittney Hughes to explore the world of the Venus Fly Traps, Sundews, Bladderworts, Butterworts, & Pitcher Plants and how each one catches their prey. Additionally, she will have live plants & talk about the Green Pitcher Plant Project, a park effort to ensure Lookout Mountain's native, federally-listed endangered pitcher plant is protected and will thrive over many generations. Seating is limited, so bring your own comfortable camp chair if you wish.

Little River Canyon National Preserve Annual Bioblitz

Calling all photographers, botanists, birders, herpers, insect enthusiasts..... well, if you love nature, and you love Little River Canyon Preserve, then join us for the BioBlitz! Plan on coming out sometime from Friday, May 19th to Saturday, May 20th to help us document the flora and fauna of the park. Little River Canyon is a biological hotspot! It is home to roughly 50 species of reptiles and amphibians, 40 species of fish, over 145 species of birds, and many rare, threatened, or endangered species of plants. We want everyone to come out and help. We will be exploring the park with scientists, naturalists, students, and professors (oh my!) and the public is encouraged to join us. The public can explore, learn and become Citizen Scientists by helping to record the presence and distribution of our species. Tentative schedule:
