CAMPGROUND

Ninety-one improved campsites overlook the scenic 250-acre lake. All sites have water, 30-amp and 50-amp electric service and 35 sites have sewer hookups. Six primitive camp sites are also available for rent. A sewage dumping station, and three bathhouse facilities are available.

SWIMMING

A sandy beach area along the shore of Lake Lurleen provides a comfortable place to relax and enjoy a refreshing swim.

MEETING/BANQUET ROOM AND PAVILIONS

For group events, a banquet room and four outside pavilions are available for rent by calling the park office. A small pavilion at the beach is also available for rent.

TRAILS

The Tashka Trail System totals almost 24 miles of trails comprised of one main trail with five loops off of the main trail. The system has two trail heads (north and south) to access the trails and can be used for hiking and biking. This trail system is home to several annual events and is a popular destination for the hiking and biking community. Lake Lurleen State Park is also a part of the Alabama Birding Trails. The Tashka Trail System and the lake are both excellent places to bird watch.

LAKE ACTIVITIES

The main attraction at the park is 250-acre Lake Lurleen. The lake measures nearly 1 1/2 miles in length, ½-half mile wide, and at its deepest is 48 feet. The lake has largemouth bass, bream, catfish and crappie so anglers are sure to reel in a nice-sized catch. Boat launch areas and ample pier and bank fishing are available.
