

Camping Regulations

- All campers must register before entering the campground.
- **Campers must occupy site immediately after registration.**
- Only one camping unit per site! The exception is a family with children under the age of 18, can add one extra tent for a per night charge. All sites are one flat rate for up to four people with an extra fee per night, per person up to eight people.
- Maximum occupancy per site: eight people, two motor vehicles.
- Occupancy is limited to 14 days - April 15 thru October 1.
- Pets must be kept on a leash. They are not allowed on beaches or in buildings.
- Campers must provide their own equipment suitable for the location, subject to the Manager's approval. A camping permit is required before setting up camp.

- A responsible adult must accompany minors under the age of 18.
- Fires are permitted in fire pits only.
- All motor vehicles must have state license and be operated by a licensed driver on established roadways designated for their use only. Indiscriminate riding back and forth is strictly forbidden.
- All trash must be deposited in the dumpsters on the right as you exit the campground.

Complete State Park Rules and Regulations are posted in a conspicuous location.

- The campground is open for camping year-round.
- RV sites are available with water, electric and sewer hook-ups.
- Tent sites have water in the vicinity.
- RV storage is available by day or month.
- Equestrian Campground (12 Pull Through 50 Amp Full Hook-up sites). Contact Park Staff.

A separate Hiking Trail Map is available for purchase.

Oak Mountain State Park is located fifteen miles south of Birmingham and is accessible from Interstate 65, Exit 246.

Oak Mountain, Alabama's largest State Park at nearly 10,000 acres, is located in the Southernmost part of the Appalachian chain.

A scenic drive to the top of Double Oak Mountain provides views comparable to those found in the Great Smoky Mountains.
