DeSoto State Park's Campfire Talk Series



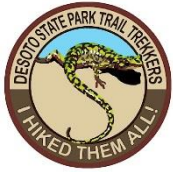

Carnivorous Killers-The Horrors that Lurk Within

Join us for a fun campfire talk in the great outdoors! Campfire Talks are a series of educational & entertaining programs located in the great outdoors. Campfire programs are held many Friday & Saturday evening (May – October) in DeSoto State Park.

'Feed Me Seymour!' Come on out to discover facts about these unusual plants that are carnivorous, meaning they digest insects and other organisms. They live in boggy, wet areas that are low in nutrients, and have evolved over time to eat prey to survive. People have long been drawn to these weird but lovable plants, enthralled by visions of man-eaters out of "Little Shop of Horrors." (no worries, none are big enough to eat humans.... yet)

Join DeSoto State Park Naturalist Brittney Hughes to explore the world of the Venus Fly Traps, Sundews, Bladderworts, Butterworts, & Pitcher Plants and how each one catches their prey.

Additionally, she will have live plants & talk about the Green Pitcher Plant Project, a park effort to ensure Lookout Mountain's native, federally-listed endangered pitcher plant is protected and will thrive over many generations. Seating is limited, so bring your own comfortable camp chair if you wish.

Campfire Talk: Hernando DeSoto in Northeast Alabama.

Join us for a fun campfire talk in the Great Outdoors!

Hernando de Soto, a Spanish explorer and conquistador is most famous for his exploration of North America. He & over 600 men landed in North America 483 years ago on May 25, 1538. They first arrived near what is now Tampa Bay, Florida & spent the next four years traveling over 4,000 miles all over the American Southeast. They went to a total of ten states that exist today, & De Soto and his men were the first Europeans to reach and cross the Mississippi River.

Jacksonville State University's Dr. Harry Holstein will take you through the amazing adventures of Hernando DeSoto, as he searches for the ancient town of "Coosa."

Enjoy the peace and quiet of nature as we paddle upstream on the 'coke bottle clear' waters of the West Fork of Little River. Enjoy this flatwater paddle as the sun goes down and the full moon comes up. Experience the peace & quiet of the gloaming-time!

What to know: This trip is approximately 4 miles round trip on flatwater, spans a 3 to 3 1/2-hour period and includes kayak, paddle, & personal flotation device. Weight limits: 300 pounds for singles & 450 for tandems. Ages 8 to adult.

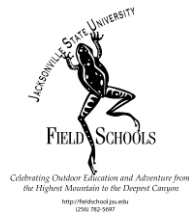
What to bring: Appropriate clothing, headlamp or flashlight, bug spray, snacks, and drinking water.
