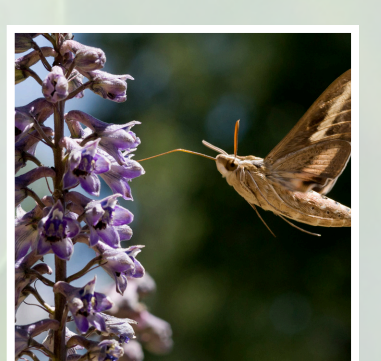
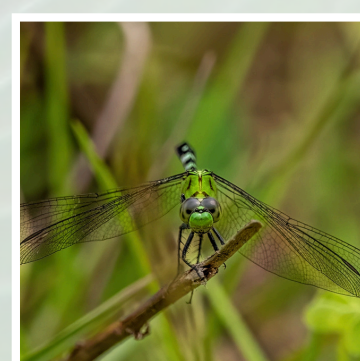
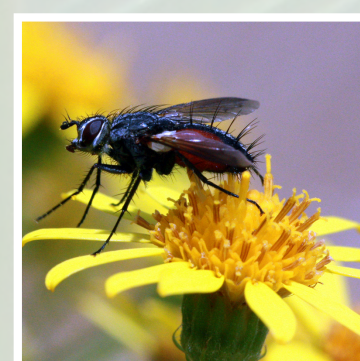
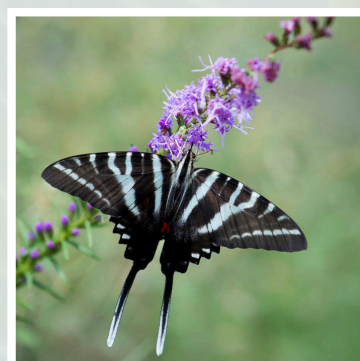
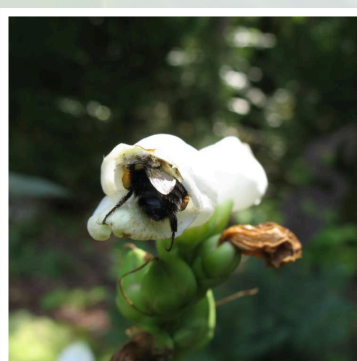
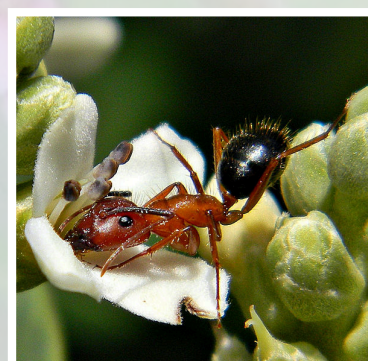
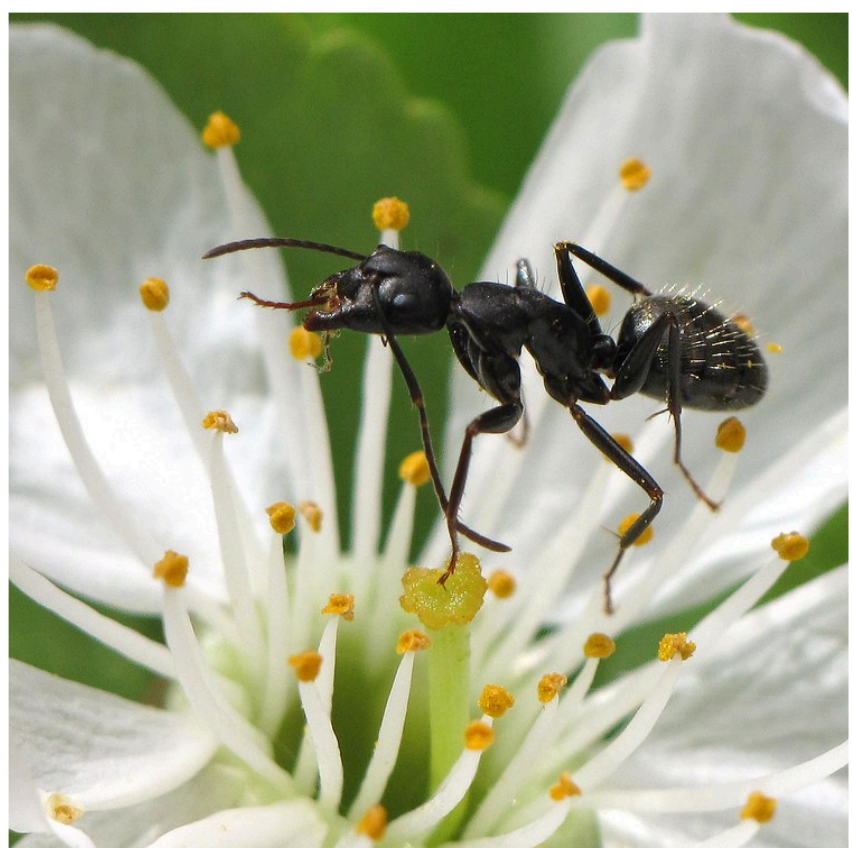
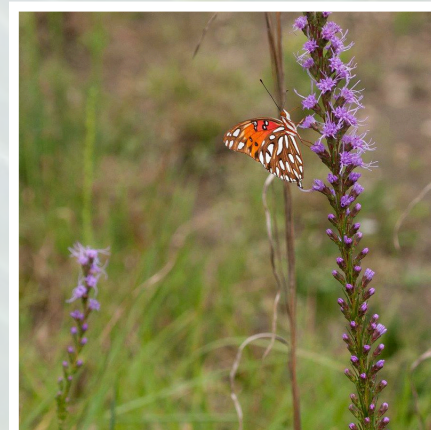


For millions of years, plants and insects have been teaming up in remarkable ways!
